■ Regarding the Use of Photos and Videos Taken at Event Venues

Kindly note that as an attendee, you may appear in photos or videos taken by event organizers, contracted vendors, mass media, or official influencers. These photos and videos may be used not only as official records of the organizing committee but also for advertising, promotional, or media coverage purposes. We appreciate your understanding in advance.

■ Photography and Video Recording at Event Venues

Photography and video recording are permitted within the venues. However, kindly adhere to the following rules. Please note that the event organizers reserve the right to restrict photography or video recording if deemed inappropriate.



Please obtain permission from individuals before taking photos or videos of them.



The use of monopods, tripods, and selfie sticks is prohibited.



Photography and video recording are not allowed in indicated areas.



Any photography or filming that interferes with event operations, disturbs other guests, violates laws, or disrupts public order and morals is strictly prohibited.

■ Prohibited Items



Explosives and high-pressure gas containers such as gas canisters



Flammable items such as matches



Knives, scissors, and other such objects with blades



Camera monopods, tripods, and selfie sticks



Golf clubs, bats, and other such dangerous items



All alcoholic beverages and canned or bottled drinks



Drones and other such remotecontrolled devices



Bicycles, scooters, skateboards, and other such wheeled apparatuses



Animals (except service dogs, hearing dogs, and guide dogs)



Flags, banners, and other such items intended for display



Megaphones and other sound amplification devices



Any other items deemed unsafe

■ Prohibited Conduct within Event Venues

Engaging in any of the following prohibited behavior may result in removal from the venue or a police report.



Entering restricted areas



Littering



Causing trouble or disturbance



Distributing flyers, collecting donations, or soliciting signatures



Damaging or defacing venue facilities or equipment



Smoking outside of designated smoking areas



Unauthorized commercial activity



Acts that violate public order and morals
